

### WHY ARE DISTRICTS CLOSING?

Governor Kristi Noem has asked school districts to close in order to practice social distancing and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

We are in an extremely unique time in our history with this global pandemic and must continue to make many tough decisions in the days and weeks to come. As this situation evolves, we will adjust our plans and day-to-day operations as necessary.

### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

We are working closely with State health officials to determine how to best mitigate the impact closing schools will have on our families. The School District will provide grab-and-go meals for our students and has implemented a learning plan for all students.
