

Crafts

Course Description: [Crafts is a hands-on course designed to give students opportunities to develop skills in a variety of craft techniques. The course delves into the history of each craft and its application to today's society. There are numerous connections to the core academic areas. Examples of the skills that may be developed include macramé, decoupage, weaving, crocheting, paper craft, bookbinding, sewing and stamping.

Attendance: Students are required to be in school every day. Students are responsible for communicating with their teachers to make up missed learning.

Essential Skills: [Student should be able to do the following:

- 1. Use the Elements and Principles of Art to create a craft project.
- 2. Use problem solving skills to be creative.
- 3. Go above and beyond, finding ways to do better
- 4. TBD
