Course Description

Students will build upon previously learned skills and will learn new techniques which will enable the student to progress with ease to the next level. Students will advance their technique by performing more advanced string literature in concerts, preparing and performing in a small ensemble or solo, and developing critical listening skills. Students are eligible to participate in All-State Orchestra.

Grading

30% Participation and Technique Building:

• Participation in class: Does student have a usable instrument; is student on time and ready to go; is student actively participating in class

Textbook

Music to be performed at the concert. All music is picked based upon state prescribed lists, such as Florida and Texas.

Reading

The students will read and notate language in the musical form. They will learn musical terms based upon the SD High School Activities Association's approved list of musical terms.

Optional Reading

Students may decide to read music that they find on their own. In addition, the use of programs such as Muscore and Smart Music can be used to facilitate a better understand of the music.
