

# **STAGECRAFT**

<u>Course Description</u>: The class emphasizes basic backstage training for production. Basic stagecraft safety, publicity, drafting, design, stage makeup, costuming, properties, stage lighting, sound & painting are all topics covered in this class.

**Attendance:** Students are required to be in school every day. Students are responsible for communicating with their teachers to make up missed learning.
