Course Description: This course is a year-long course fulfilling the twelfth grade English requirement. This course integrates all twelfth grade ELA standards. Students will explore ethics and inclusion while engaging in projects and activities that will help them develop advanced levels of reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills.
