Introduction to Health Service

Course Description:

Students are introduced to Pre healthcare and allied Healthcare professions as well as exploring different medical facilities. Students will also be introduced to different medical equipment and investigate some of the legal aspects of the healthcare profession. Introduction to Health Service I is a prerequisite for Health Service II.

Together these classes are a yearlong together.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will be able to differentiate between private and public/government healthcare settings (managed care)

Students will be able to collaborate and communicate effectively with colleagues, patients/residents, and/or family members.

Students will identify positive and negative traits of a health care worker.

Students will be able to identify and compare health science career (pathways Pre-Health professionals & Allied Health)

Students will understand the levels of education and credentials required for a variety of health science careers of interest and the introduction to cost and methods to finance and scholarships available.

Students will explore and demonstrate knowledge of employment opportunities, workplace environments and career growth potential.

Students will understand the legal/ethical issues, religious and cultural diversity, mental health/competence and their impacts on healthcare.

Students will understand the scope of practice state specific requirements and a variety of professional Standards including the American Medical Association, American Nurse Association, American Dental Association.

Students will understand the implications of Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) for healthcare professionals.

Students will be able to identify common safety hazards in the healthcare environment including patient/resident, community, and healthcare worker settings.

Students will be able to apply different principles of body mechanics and ergonomics.
