- Students will understand the implications of Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) for healthcare professionals.
- Students will be able to identify common safety hazards in the healthcare environment including patient/ resident, community, and healthcare worker settings.
- Students will be able to apply different principles of body mechanics and ergonomics.
