Grading

Spanish courses are **MASTERY BASED.** You cannot move forward until you have mastered the required content. You will be given an opportunity to pre-assess through modules. If a pre-assessment is passed, you advance directly to the mastery tasks of the module. If a pre-assessment is not passed, you are required to complete all notes, practice, and mastery tasks before moving forward to the next module. **Mastery tasks must demonstrate mastery before moving forward. This means a score of 70% or higher is achieved.**
