WORLD GEOGRAPHY OF THE EASTERN HEMISPHERE

RCAS POLICIES/PROCEDURES

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

World Geography is designed to analyze portions of the Eastern Hemisphere and incorporates elements of geography, history, civics, and economics within that curriculum. This is a required semester course.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Students will identify continents and countries within the Eastern Hemisphere.
- 2. Students will be able to distinguish that cultures of different regions are influenced by physical characteristics.
- 3. Students will discover cultural characteristics of each continent studied.
- 4. Students will explore the similarities and differences that exist in people around the world.
- 5. Through society-centered teaching, students will make the connection between geography and the world in which they live.
 - 6. Students will apply geospatial resources, including data sources and geographic tools to generate, interpret, and analyze information.
 - 7. Students will understand the nature and importance of the Five Themes of Geography-Location, Place, Human-Environment Interaction, Movement, and Region.
 - 8. Students will recognize the characteristics of the processes that shape places and regions.
 - 9. Students will identify Earth's physical systems and the ways in which they are dynamic and interactive.
 - 10. Students will recognize and explain the role population and culture play in creating diversity within the world's places and regions.
 - 11. Students will understand the ways in which humans culturally and physically adapt to, use, and modify the natural environment and its various elements.

12. Students will apply geography knowledge to understand the diversity of Earth's physical and human conditions.
