Course Description

In United States History 2, you will understand: the impact of the Industrial Revolution and Immigration during the late 1800s, the challenges of Western Expansion after the Civil War, attempts by men and women to improve American society, the impact at home and abroad of American Imperialism, the causes and effects of World War I at home and abroad, the roaring 1920s, and the causes and impact of the Great Depression.

Course Learning Outcomes

Topic 10—Post Civil War Wester Expansion

- 1. I can analyze the concept sovereignty and treaties impacted assimilation of Native American livelihood and culture throughout the nation in the late 1800s and early 1900s.
- 2. I can examine how post-Civil War Western Expansion had a positive and negative impact on the United States socially and environmentally.

Topic 9—Industry and Big Business

- 3. I can examine different factors of the Second Industrial Revolution and how the development of big business impacted the United States.
- 4. I can examine how working conditions and low pay led to the rise of labor unions during the Second Industrial Revolution.
- 5. I can investigate the push and pull causes of immigration in the late 1800s and early 1900s, while also explaining the lasting impact of immigration on the United States.

Topic 11—Progressive Era

6. Learners will investigate how individuals and groups reacted to social, political, and economic problems during the Progressive Era.

Topic 11- Imperialism

7. Learners will analyze the causes and impact of American Imperialism on the United States domestically and internationally.

Topic 12—World War I

- 8. Learners will identify and describe how World War I started and how the United States was brought into the war.
- 9. Learners will explain the change that took place within the United States once the United States enters WW I.
- 10. Learners will analyze the President Wilson's 14 points and explain the details and lasting impact of the Treat of Versailles.

Topic 12-1920s

- 11. Learners will explain the positive and negative aspects of the 1920s economy.
- 12. Learners will explain the impact of the Harlem Renaissance, the Red Scare, prohibition, and the rise of the Ku Klux Klan on the United States.

Topic 13—The Great Depression

- 13. Learners will investigate and explain the root causes of the Great Depression and what people did to survive the economic crisis and the Dust Bowl.
- 14. Learners will research and describe how the New Deal changed how people view the role of the government during economic recessions and depressions.
