Course Description

This course will investigate the history of the United States from World War II to the present. Students will be able to identify significant people and events. Students will analyze primary and secondary source documents that have shaped America's modern era.

In United States History 3, you will understand: the causes and effects of World War II, the Cold War domestic and foreign policies, the Civil Rights Movement, the challenges of the 1970s, the successes and failures of the economic policies of the 1980s and 1990s, and the challenges and benefits of living in a globalized 21st Century.

- 11. I can investigate the key events and impact of the Nixon and Ford's Presidencies and the Watergate Scandal.
- 12. I can explain the key events and economic issues of Carter's Presidency.

- 13. I can analyze the importance of Reagan's and Bush's Presidencies, Reaganomics and the end of the Cold War on the United States.
- 14. I can explain the impact of social, economic and political issues during the 1990s.

15. I can analyze and explain the key events and impact of Presidents George W. Bush's and Barack Obama's times in Presidents.
