

Media Production

Course Description:

Have fun while exploring equipment operations, employability skills, software applications, careers, social networking & media law. You will not only learn the creative process of filmmaking, but inevitably learn reading/writing (scripting/storyboarding), drama (directing, casting & acting), marketing (media production & distribution), ambiance (lighting) & technology (visual effects & editing).

Attendance: Students are required to be in school every day. Students are responsible for communicating with their teachers to make-up for missed learning.

Essential Skills:

- 1. Students will gain an understanding of the entire movie making process.
- 2. Students will experience & demonstrate audio along with video editing skills.
- 3. Students will understand the best distribution method for finished media projects.
