<u>Course Description</u>: This course evaluates the history of the United States from the Founding through Civil War Reconstruction. Students will compare and contrast the social, political, and economic forces that impacted our nation. Students will analyze primary and secondary documents that have shaped America's founding.

<u>Attendance:</u> Students are required to be in school every day. Students are responsible for communicating with their teachers to make up missed learning.

Essential Skills: 1. Evaluating sources a. I can gather and evaluate sources. 2. Argumentation a. I can identify arguments. B. I can support and defend arguments 3. Historical comprehension a. I can demonstrate social studies comprehension.

<u>Course Expectations</u>: Although not everything is graded, everything is important. In order to demonstrate growth and learning, students will need to:

- 1. Participate in class activities (take notes, work in a group, complete in-class tasks, ask questions) without distractions (cell phones, ear buds, games, etc.)
- 2. Use morning time and teacher to seek help outside of class when needed.
- 3. Complete all assessments within teacher timelines.
