Parents Right-To-Know: Timely Notice of Limited State Certification and Licensure

Dear Parents,

The federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires schools that receive Title I, Part A funds to notify parents or legal guardians when their child has been taught for four (4) consecutive weeks by a teacher who has not met "applicable State certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned." [ESSA Sec. 1112(e)(1)(b)(ii)]

Although South Dakota has some of the most demanding certification requirements in the country, these requirements do not automatically mean that every teacher meets the standard, even if they have been teaching for years or have been performing at high levels. Certain teachers, even outstanding veteran teachers, may need to take the time to comply with new expectations if they happen to change class assignments and do not have the new certification.

As of this writing, your child's teacher **Mr. Perkins, PE Teacher, <mark>Has Not</mark> obtained full** state certification in South Dakota

As of the date of this letter, your child's teacher **Mr. Perkins** is currently working to meet the above requirement(s) and we have full confidence in their ability to teach effectively in this assignment.
