
## Course Selection Process

#### Stevens High School Commonly Asked Questions



#### WHAT IS A CREDIT?

A credit is what you earn when you pass a course. You need minimum of 22 credits to graduate from high school, which includes a combination of required and elective classes. All classes are .5 credit and will be permanently documented on the transcript at the conclusion of each semester.

#### 2. HOW DO I KNOW WHICH CLASSES I NEED TO TAKE?

Consider class choices carefully. Visit with school counselors, teachers, and parents to gather information to make class choices. Take the time to read the Freshmen Academy Guidebook for details about courses and graduation requirements.

#### 3. WILL I AUTOMATICALLY GO TO THE NEXT GRADE IF I FAIL COURSES?

**No.** Grade level classification is determined by the number of credits earned **NOT** by years of attendance.

#### 4. WHAT HAPPENS IF I FAIL A COURSE?

Beginning in ninth grade, students EARN credits toward graduation. You must pass courses to earn credit. If you fail a course, you will have to re-take required courses, or take another course to replace the credit you lost through failure. Summer school is an option to earn lost credits. It is important to remember that your high school career begins the minute you enter Stevens High School in the fall.

#### HOW MANY COURSES SHOULD I TAKE?

Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 are required to enroll in a minimum of six (6) courses per semester. Our goal is to ensure you are set up for success. It is highly recommended that freshmen enroll in no more than six courses per semester. This approach will keep you on track for graduation while providing a smooth and manageable transition to high school. Classes may be cancelled for the following reasons: low enrollment, registration number exceeds class capacity, and program cuts.


### **How You Can Support**

## The Anxious Generation By Johnathan Haidt

Jonathan Haidt examines the alarming rise in depression and anxiety and attributes the crisis to use of smart phones. These factors contribute to increased anxiety and mental health challenges.



- **1. Social Deprivation**: Reduced face-to-face interactions leading to weakened social skills and connections.
- Sleep Deprivation: Disrupted sleep patterns due to late-night device use and exposure to screen light.
- Attention Fragmentation: Decreased ability to focus, resulting from constant notifications and multitasking.
- **4. Addiction**: Compulsive device usage driven by the design of apps and platforms to capture attention.
