

General Beadle Family and Community Engagement Plan (FACE)

General Beadle is a school-wide Title I program. This means that all students in our school have equal access to resources provided by the Title I grant.

This school, family, and community engagement plan was developed jointly with, distributed to, and agreed upon with families of participating children.

- The school used feedback from stakeholders in the development of this plan. Feedback was gathered through the Comprehensive Needs Assessment at the start of the 2021-22 school year. (42 staff members, 18 teachers, 10 students, and 41 guardians responded to a survey; feedback was also collected through focus groups of students, parents, and teachers.)
- School administration will share the plan during the Sept. 29th family night event. The plan will be provided in writing and verbally explained during a family night.
- Staff will have a chance to identify talking points regarding the plan so that they can also share its goals.
- School administration will continue to collect feedback from parents during Parent Voice chats with one in the fall (Nov. 17th) and one in the spring (April 13th).

Family Involvement	 To ensure effective involvement of families in supporting their child at school, the school will: We will host two Parent Voice chats this school year. All families are welcome to take part in these discussions. The Parent Voice chat is facilitated by Black Hills Special Services Cooperative. The hour-long meetings are just for parents to share their ideas for improving the school. We started these during the 2021-22 school year and it was incredibly positive. Parents are invited to volunteer during our Family Night events and in classrooms during the school-day. Teachers prepare materials for students to practice literacy and math skills at home. During longer breaks such as winter break and spring break, all teachers provide home interactive homework. Research has found interactive homework to have one of the largest positive effects on family engagement. Parents can attend conferences in-person, by phone, or virtually.

	 Our school counselor and social worker work individually with students and families on developing habits for success in school.
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	• We are committed to ensuring all families feel welcome to come to the office or call us with questions or concerns. Part of this is to have a slideshow of General Beadle students, staff, and families on a panel in the entryway.

	• There are multiple teams that oversee the case management of students. These are the teams:
	o Guiding Coalition is the overarching team that develops our schoolwide plan, reviews data, determines strategies, and
Student Case Management	evaluates the effectiveness. We then have teams branched off of this: The PBIS (Behavior & Attendance) Team; Building
	Leadership Team; Attendance Tier 2 team; Intervention and Special Education Team. In addition, we utilize task forces to
	research certain topics such as ELL instruction and welcoming new students.
	• Each team discussed above reaches out to families to be partners in providing supports to students
	Behavior and attendance data are used to identify students; teachers or guardians can also refer a student; plans are reviewed every 6
	weeks to determine if the intensity needs to increase or decrease.
Community and	We have started a partnership with Teammates. This will allow for students to be paired with mentors. We have built trusting
Partnerships	relationships in the building. We are seeking to foster relationships between students and trusted adults in the community.

	 We are expanding to host two Parent Fair events this year (Oct. 13th & April 13th). We have partnered with Black Hills Special
	Services Cooperative to plan this event. We invite all community agencies to join us at General Beadle to provide information on the
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	services they provide. From early childhood education, Salvation Army, McKinney Vento services, Great Plains Tribal Health board,
	etc.
	We again will host a Kindergarten transition night for the district (March 9th). This pulls together agency partners to assist in
	transitioning students from preschool to kindergarten.
